Zatta's portable atlas, containing maps of the world, the four continents, the Ottoman Empire, four maps of Italy and two of France, the rest being other parts of Europe. The four maps added to this second edition are: France divided into the post-Revolution Departements; Switzerland; the kingdoms of Naples and Sicily; and the Partitions of Poland of 1773 & 1793 (the folding map). Australia only appears on the double-hemisphere world map. Although New Zealand is shown according to Cook, the coast of New South Wales extends too far east.
