An early example of Seutter's atlas, published before he was made Imperial Geographer by Karl VI in 1731. It contains a celestial map, world and continents, Turkish Empire, Holy Land, the other 18 European countries. Each map is accompanied by an alphabetical index as a double page printed sheet. A handsome book to add to a good atlas collection.
